NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

Documents governing this event, including this Notice of Race and any amendments thereto, will be available at the event website:

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Competitors should note that Hayling Island SC implements the RYA Racing Charter and that they will be expected to sail in compliance with it. The Charter can be found at: www.rya.org.uk/racing/racing-rules/pages/hub.aspx
- 1.3 The notation [DP] in a rule of the NoR or SI means that the penalty for breaching the rule is at the discretion of the protest committee.

2 ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to all RS Tera class dinghies. There will be separate racing for the Pro and Sport rigged boats.
- 2.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry form on the Hayling Island SC website and submitting the entry fee. The closing date for entries is Thursday 11 May. After that date entries will be accepted at registration
- 2.3 Competitors under 18 years of age during the event shall submit signed Parent/Guardian Declarations before racing (download from HISC website).

3 FEES

Entry fee per boat: £30.00

Entries received after 11 May will be subject to a surcharge of £5.00

4 SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Registration: 13 May from 09:00.
- 4.2 There will be a briefing for competitors on Sat 13 May at 11:30.
- 4.3 The race schedule is as follows:

- 4.4 The sailing instructions will specify a time on the last day of racing after which no warning signal may be made.

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be published on the event website.

6 VENUE

- 6.1 Racing will take place in Chichester Harbour.
6.2 Venue information is available at www.hisc.co.uk.

7 SCORING

- 7.1 One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
7.2 (a) When fewer than three races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
(b) When three or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

8 SUPPORT BOATS

[DP] Support boats shall register at the Race Office during the registration period.

9 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded depending on the number of entries in each fleet.

10 MEDIA RIGHTS

Competitors automatically grant to the organizing authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.

11 RISK STATEMENT

- 11.1 Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."
11.2 Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
 - (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
 - (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omission;
 - (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
 - (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
 - (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
 - (g) It is their responsibility to familiarize themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.
 - (h) Their boat is adequately insured, with cover of at least £2 million against third-party claims, or the equivalent in other currencies.
